

The year 2017 will mark 148 years of existence for Star Pilgrim Baptist Church. The church has served the New Iberia community as a "spirit-filled church. Formerly known as "The Old Ironside Baptist Church", it was founded in the year of our Lord 1869 by former slaves and the descendants of slave only four years after the Emancipation Proclamation.

During the establishment of the church, its founders chose the Rev. Jessie Giles to serve as their pastor for 28 years to their waiting congregation. Others to serve were Rev. A. J. Horton, 19 years; Rev. Prince Albert, 16 years; Rev. William Bowser, 2 years; Rev. John Parker, 24 years; Rev. Cyrus V. Jackson, 39 years; Rev. Adam Curley, 1 year as a supply minister; Rev. Ernest M. Davis, 10 months; Rev. Francis L. Davis, 10 years; Rev. Craig Gregory, 2 years; and Rev. Shawn P. Watson, 3.5 years. Star Pilgrim's former pastors have richly blessed us with understanding the teachings, preaching and pastoral care.

While Star Pilgrim has a long illustrious history and rich tradition, we have seen the Lord God work mightily among us. We have had seasons of encouragement and seasons of trials, but through it all God remains faithful.
